Five Finger Breathing

- Spread one hand out wide like a star. You can choose to use your left or right hand. You will use the pointer finger of your other hand to trace around the hand with fingers spread like a star.
- 2 Start with your pointer finger at the base of your thumb.
 Breathe in as you slide your finger up to the top of your thumb, pause, and then breathe out as you slide your finger down the other side of your thumb. Continue by sliding your pointer finger up the side of your opposite pointer finger and down the other side. Do the same for the middle, ring, and pinky finger.
- 3 Continue this process until you have traced all fingers, breathing along the way. Keep this practice up until you feel calm and settled.
